

Lesson 10 - Be On Guard (part 2)

I. Introduction:

- A. In addition to the intellectual challenges and dangers to the Christian faith that we looked at in the last lesson, there are emotional and moral dangers which we will deal with in this lesson.
- B. Words and Concepts:
 - 1. **Lust** - In the New Testament, the word, "lust" is not as restrictive in meaning as the English word, "lust." Lust in English has a sexual connotation, whereas in the New Testament it may or may not be sexual in nature. If it is not used in a sexual context, it is translated, "desire." In James 1:14-15, the "desire" that eventually gives birth to sin is not always necessarily sexual desire.
 - 2. **Fellowship** - Fellowship means to hold in common. It is not the same thing as association because you can associate with someone that you have nothing in common with. Christian fellowship is based on Christ. All those who have accepted Christ as Lord, have been baptized, and are faithful servants of his have "fellowship" with each other "in Christ." This is the most significant thing they share in common.
 - 3. **Idolatry** - The most basic meaning of this is to serve, honor, acknowledge, or worship something that is the creation of man's hands. In ancient times, it referred to statues that people built as a representation of their so-called god. The root problem of idolatry is that man is worshiping something he has created rather than worshipping the one who has created him. In idolatry, man is the one in control of his so-called god and does the talking while the idol is mute, powerless, dead, in danger of falling over, etc. In effect, man becomes his own god.


