

Lesson 13 - Final Instructions

I. Colossians 4:2-6

A. Introduction

This final paragraph of instruction deals with prayer, evangelism, and ministry. These are all tied together as you cannot have the true strength for evangelism and ministry without a good prayer life.

Verses 7 to the end of the book are personal greetings between Paul and his personal friends acquaintances, and brethren. We will not spend a lot of time in this section, but will make a few observations

B. Terms and Concepts

1. **Wisdom** - Wisdom is a combination of sound knowledge, understanding, discernment, and the skill to put it to practice in a way that honors God. According to the Biblical perspective, wisdom comes ultimately from knowing God. (Prov 1:7; 9:10; James 1:5)
2. **Outsiders** - Outsiders are simply those who have not yet obeyed the Gospel. Because they have not obeyed the Gospel, they are "outside" of Christ and therefore outside of the body of Christ, even though they may have friendship with those within the body.
