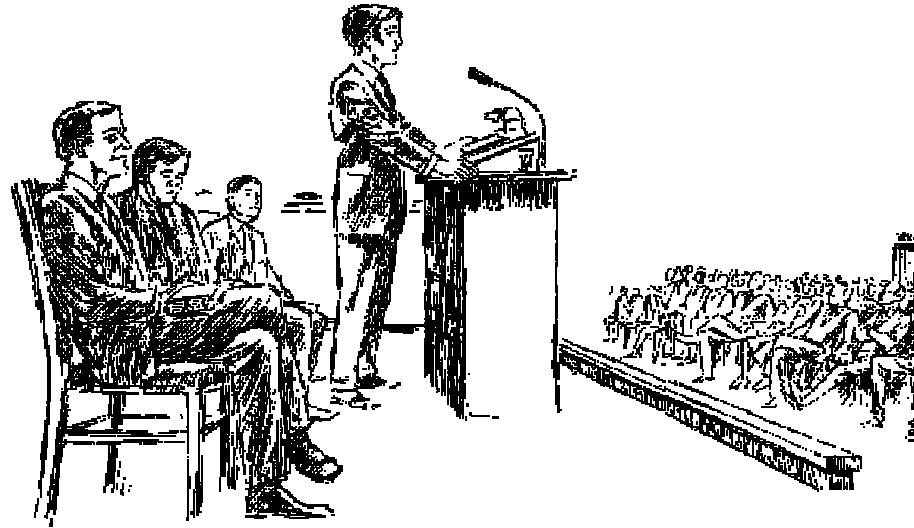


Worship Leadership: Striving for Excellence
